

324 children are enrolled in our Lutheran Elementary School

LOOK BACK AND BE ENCOURAGED



Our Generous God has created us to be Generous People with a Generous Vision!

Let us give thanks to God for what he has accomplished through us financially since our last building program in 2010.

The \$3.3 million mortgage on the Trinity Gym/Café/Classroom addition paid off in November 2023, six years early.

An internal debt of over \$250,000 from a decade of operating deficits has been erased.



The Cool Million campaign provided \$1 million in special gifts to make significant improvements to our school and church buildings.

We have established a Capital Reserves Fund and an LES Stabilization Fund to prepare our congregation for future opportunities and challenges.

St. Paul's continues to be a leader in supporting our synod and high school.



Over the last two years, St. Paul's/The Bridge contributed \$5.7 million to support on-campus and off-campus mission and ministry.

Could our generous God give us the strength for a time of special dedication? Could he enable us to nearly double our giving to \$10 million over the next two years?

Is this our defining moment?

The Because iT Matters generosity initiative includes our giving for our current ministry and missions and giving to enhance our facilities for gospel outreach.



Million Over 2 Years

BECAUSE THE MINISTRY MATTERS

Our gospel ministry impacts hundreds of people every single week. Over the next two years, **Because iT Matters** will provide the \$2 million needed each year for our Mission and Ministry Fund to keep St. Paul's and The Bridge moving forward as a church and Christian school to bring more people closer to Christ.



BECAUSE THE MISSION MATTERS

Over the next two years, **Because iT Matters** will enable us to increase our support of synod mission work and the mission efforts of Wisconsin Lutheran High School. It will also provide \$50,000 for our mission partners and \$200,000 for ministry enhancements at The Bridge MKE.

BECAUSE THE FUTURE MATTERS

We want to prepare our facilities to serve generations to come. Proposed additions to our school and church will benefit every member of the St. Paul's family and bring our Muskego campus family together for worship, Kids Club, and Bible study in one facility. Because iT Matters will provide \$5 million for facilities expansion.





God is blessing our school with a growing enrollment. Every classroom is being used.

We want to help our students use all their talents. We have no classrooms designed for the teaching of special middle school undustrial arts classes such as the current woodworking or small engine repair. We also have no dedicated space for music lessons and practice or choirs.

We are envisioning a four-classroom addition to our school to provide space to expand our curriculum and allow for enrollment growth.







Mission outreach is a core value. Expanded parking and a larger gathering/welcoming space will enable us to welcome new people to our Muskego campus.

Diversity of worship languages is our second core value. One third of our family worships at The Bridge every week. A permanent location for this worship language will enable us to continue to provide worship diversity. This new auditorium will also provide a large flexible space for multiple

uses throughout the week for all our congregation members and to serve our community.

The Family Church is another core value. To support families we will expand our child care facility and bring Sunday morning Kids Club into the same building in which parents worship.

FACILITIES VISION

BECAUSE MATTERS A One Commitment Initiative

Because iT Matters celebrates that our generous God has created us to be a generous people. Over the last two years we have given over \$5.7 million to support our ministry and our missions.

Because iT Matters also challenges us as the Apostle Paul challenged the Corinthians to "excel in the grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). To prepare our ministry for the future, can we grow our giving to \$10 million for the next two years?

You may have been part of church campaigns in the past that asked you to commit to a second gift "above and beyond" your usual gifts to make new buildings and ministries possible.

Because iT Matters is different. We are asking you to make just one commitment over the next two years that will fund our ministry, our mission, and our future vision. You will still be able to designate your gifts as you desire, but this one commitment will help us know the resources we will have for our future vision.

SO HERE'S WHAT WE'RE ASKING OF YOU

Next Steps

PRAY

Pray that God works in and through the **Because iT Matters** generosity initiative. Pray that His mission is accomplished. Ask God to make clear your part in this vision.

DISCUSS

Talk with your spouse, your family, and your small group about what this commitment will mean for the next season of your life.

COMMIT

Please mark your calendars for Commitment Weekend, November 11-12 and prepare for a worship service that will be remembered as a defining moment for our congregation and for your own faith. We are asking you to make a sacrificial commitment to radical generosity – whatever it is that God leads you to do. Follow His leading – nothing more, nothing less. It is an awesome God that we serve. Let us trust that he can do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20).

BECAUSE MATTERS

CHRISTIAN LIFE LADDER

The primary goal of Because iT Matters is that 100% of us grow in our faith.

May all of us join Paul in saying,
"Nothing except Jesus Christ and him crucified"
(1 Corinthians 2:2).



5. MY LEGACY MATTERS

I understand that I can be a blessing to generations to come. I trust God's promise to "show love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments." I make a commitment to invest in the next generation with my time, my prayers, my decisions, and my resources.

4. MY SURRENDER MATTERS

I understand that my life is no longer my own. I live for "nothing except Jesus Christ and him crucified." I surrender my hopes and dreams, my fears and pain, into the hands of my Savior. My comfort and desire is not most important. I make a commitment to pray, "Father, not my will, but yours be done."

3. THE MISSION MATTERS

I understand my primary purpose in life is to share the good news of Jesus and his cross with everyone within my area of influence. I make a commitment to live and speak in a way that gives honor to Jesus and draws the people around me closer to him.

2. THE PARTNERSHIP MATTERS

I understand the importance of my church partners to help me grow in my faith. I make a commitment to regular worship and participation in Bible studies and/or small groups.

1. THE CROSS MATTERS

I have a personal understanding of my sin and trust that Jesus died on the cross for me. I am forgiven! I make a commitment to personal spiritual growth.

BECAUSE MATTERS

GENEROSITY LADDER

The secondary goal of Because iT Matters is that 100% of us seek to "excel in the grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). The Generosity Ladder corresponds to the Christian Life Ladder.

When "Nothing except Jesus Christ and him crucified" becomes the theme of our lives, it also becomes the theme of our generosity.



5. THE LEGACY GIVER

Your faith in Jesus leads you to make financial decisions that can positively impact generations to come. You may be considering how you can make the largest gift you have ever made, knowing that children not yet born will benefit from your generosity. Setting a lifetime giving goal or making/updating your estate plan to make your generosity live on after you may be your next step to "excel in the grace of giving."

4. THE SURRENDERED GIVER

Your faith in Jesus leads you to acknowledge that everything you have belongs to Jesus. Your focus changes from what you are giving to what you are not giving. You ask, "What is holding me back from giving more?" Life decisions and financial decisions begin to be made to enable you to be more generous. Deciding to give an appreciated asset may be your next step to "excel in the grace of giving."

3. THE INTENTIONAL GIVER

Your faith in Jesus leads you to ask questions like, "Is my car payment or my mortgage more important to me than the mission Jesus has given me?" Deciding to give a percentage of your income or deciding to tithe (give 10% of your income) may be your next step to "excel in the grace of giving."

2. THE CONSISTENT GIVER

Your faith in Jesus leads you to appreciate the partnership you have in God's Church. You begin to give on a regular basis, weekly or monthly. Making a recurring online gift may be the next step to "excel in the grace of giving.'

1. THE INITIAL GIVER

Your faith in Jesus as your Savior moves you to give for the first time. Your gifts are an offering of praise to God for your salvation.



Week 1 - October 15Message Notes: **The Cross Matters**

THE CROSS CHANGES AN ENEMY INTO A MISSIONARY



Acts 9:1-19

"This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles and their kings and to the people of Israel. I will show him how much he must suffer for my name."

"Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

I have a new identity.

I have a new purpose.

I have a new strength.

My Next Steps:

- Because the cross matters to you, be ready to share your story with others. On the next page, write down how the cross of Jesus has changed you. Tell your story to a friend or family member.
- Because the cross has changed you, pray and discuss with your family what God is placing on your heart as your response to the **Because iT Matters** giving initiative.

TELL YOUR STORY

Week 1: The Cross Matters Group Work Discussion

When did the cross change you? How has the cross changed you?

MAIN IDEA FOR THOUGHT

There is no middle ground. Either the cross of Christ means everything to us, or it is a sign of the judgment to come. How is this either/or reflected in my Christian living and in my Christian giving?

1. On a scale of 1 to 10 (one being "terrified" and 10 being "thrilled"), how do you feel as you begin this journey into the **Because iT Matters** giving initiative? Discuss with your group.

Luke 23:39-43

- ³⁹ One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"
- ⁴⁰ But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? ⁴¹ We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."
- ⁴² Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."
- ⁴³ Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."
- 2. Describe how Jesus' cross changed each of the criminals crucified with Jesus.
- 3. Share a time in your life when you understood for the first time or in a new way how Jesus' cross changed your life.

Titus 3:3-8

³ At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. ⁴ But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, ⁵ he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. ⁸ This is a trustworthy saying. And I want you to stress these things, so that those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good. These things are excellent and profitable for everyone.

- 4. For many Christians, the cross changed us at our baptism. How do each of the following words help you appreciate your baptismal change?
- Washing (See Acts 22:16)
- · Rebirth (See John 3:3-8)
- · Renewal (See Ephesians 4:22-24)
- By the Holy Spirit (See 1 Corinthians 12:3)

5. Compare Titus 3:3 and 3:8. Describe the change Jesus' cross and baptism work in a believer.

1 Corinthians 2:2

And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. ² For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. ³ I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. ⁴ My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, ⁵ so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power.

6. Paul was certainly excited about "Jesus Christ and him crucified," but he was also filled with fear and trembling as he took up his missionary task. Look back at your first discussion question. The **Because iT Matters** giving initiative is exciting for us too, but it also can fill us with fear and trembling. Discuss how our response to **Because iT Matters** can demonstrate the Spirit's power at work in us.

7. How do you think your response to **Because iT Matters** will impact those in your area of influence? How will they see God's power at work in you?

Week 2 - October 22 Message Notes: The Partnership Matters





Philippians 1:1-11

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." "God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus." "This is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight."

THE PARTNERSHIP IS FORGED BY A COMMON FAITH

The partnership is strengthened by mutual love.

The partnership is united in prayer.

The partnership supports the mission.

Week 2: The Partnership Matters

MAIN IDEA FOR THOUGHT

God's church is designed to be a partnership. The church is only as strong as the partnership that exists among its members. How can **Because it Matters** strengthen our partnership?

1. What benefit do you receive from your partnership in the church? What do you give to others in this partnership?

Exodus 17:8-14

⁸ The Amalekites came and attacked the Israelites at Rephidim. ⁹ Moses said to Joshua, "Choose some of our men and go out to fight the Amalekites. Tomorrow I will stand on top of the hill with the staff of God in my hands."

¹⁰ So Joshua fought the Amalekites as Moses had ordered, and Moses, Aaron and Hur went to the top of the hill. ¹¹ As long as Moses held up his hands, the Israelites were winning, but whenever he lowered his hands, the Amalekites were winning. ¹² When Moses' hands grew tired, they took a stone and put it under him and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held his hands up—one on one side, one on the other—so that his hands remained steady till sunset. ¹³ So Joshua overcame the Amalekite army with the sword. ¹⁴ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write this on a scroll as something to be remembered and make sure that Joshua hears it."

2. The victory over the Amalekites was the result of a partnership. What role did each of the following play in this partnership? What corresponding role might a Christian have today in our partnership within the church?

a. Moses My "Moses" role

b. Aaron and Hur My "Aaron and Hur" role

c. Joshua My "Joshua" role

d. The LORD The LORD's role in my my battles

3. Notice the LORD wanted to be sure that Joshua remembered this partnership. How can the **Because iT**Matters giving initiative help the next generation remember the LORD's partnership with us?

Matthew 10:1-11

Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness.

² These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. ⁶ Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. ⁷ As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' ⁸ Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give.

⁹ "Do not get any gold or silver or copper to take with you in your belts— ¹⁰ no bag for the journey or extra shirt or sandals or a staff, for the worker is worth his keep. ¹¹ Whatever town or village you enter, search there for some worthy person and stay at their house until you leave."

Week 3: The Mission Matters Croup Work Discussion

MAIN IDEA FOR THOUGHT

As we celebrate the Lutheran Reformation, we remember how much the cross and the mission of God's church mattered to Martin Luther and the other reformers. They were willing to risk their lives for the mission. What would it look like if I were willing to risk my life (or livelihood) for the mission presented to me in Because iT Matters?

- 1. In his book *The Freedom of the Christian Man*, Martin Luther presented two contradictory statements:
- A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none.
- A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all.

Look back at your notes from the message and discuss how both of these statements are true.

Read Daniel 6

³ Now Daniel so distinguished himself among the administrators and the satraps by his exceptional qualities that the king planned to set him over the whole kingdom. ⁴ At this, the administrators and the satraps tried to find grounds for charges against Daniel in his conduct of government affairs, but they were unable to do so. They could find no corruption in him, because he was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent...

¹⁰ Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before.

- 2. Daniel was committed to his mission to serve the LORD in his daily life. Even his enemies knew his faith meant everything to him. How can Christians today demonstrate their commitment to Christ's mission in a way that is evident to the people around them?
- 3. Daniel fulfilled his mission even though it may have cost him his life. How does his commitment to the mission inspire you to a higher level of Christian living and giving?

Mark 10:35-45

³⁵ Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."

³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.

³⁷They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."


³⁸ "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

³⁹ "We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared." ⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

- 4. James and John's desire for places of honor was not appropriate, but their willingness to drink the cup of suffering for the cross and the mission was admirable. As we pray about our response to the mission of **Because it Matters**, what might our willingness to drink the cup of suffering mean for us?
- 5. Jesus fulfilled his mission. He served us by giving his life as a ransom for us. Write a portion of your own obituary. "He/she fulfilled the mission Jesus gave him/her on earth. He/she served us by ... " What is one next step for you to make that mission dream a reality?
- 6. How does the **Because iT Matters** giving initiative provide you with an opportunity to fulfill your mission and serve others?

2 Corinthians 8:1-9

Brothers and sisters, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches.

In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity.

They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us.

Since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving.

You know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.

The Macedonians' surrendered giving encouraged the Corinthians.



MAIN IDEA FOR THOUGHT

The Macedonian congregation presented the Corinthians and us with a role model of surrendered giving. They did not have much. Paul mentions their "extreme poverty." What they did have was a "singleness of purpose." They could only be truly generous if they surrendered their hopes and dreams to Christ and focused on the mission Christ had given them. The Macedonian response amazed Paul and encouraged the Corinthians. How might our surrender to God's mission be evident in our response to Because it Matters? How might our response encourage others today and in the future?

1. Friendly competition can help two cross country runners improve both of their personal best times. Can there be friendly competition in giving that helps us all "excel in the grace of giving"? What might that competition look like today?

Read 1 Chronicles 29

² "With all my resources I have provided for the temple of my God... ⁵ Now, who is willing to consecrate themselves to the LORD today?"

⁶ Then the leaders of families ... gave willingly. ⁹ The people rejoiced at the willing response of their leaders, for they had given freely and wholeheartedly to the LORD. David the king also rejoiced greatly.

¹⁴ "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand... ¹⁶ LORD our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a temple for your Holy Name comes from your hand, and all of it belongs to you.

¹⁷ I know, my God, that you test the heart and are pleased with integrity. All these things I have given willingly and with honest intent. And now I have seen with joy how willingly your people who are here have given to you.

¹⁸ LORD, the God of our fathers Abraham, Isaac and Israel, keep these desires and thoughts in the hearts of your people forever, and keep their hearts loyal to you."

2. King David was a "surrendered giver," acknowledging everything ultimately belongs to the LORD. King David's generosity as a surrendered giver encouraged the generosity of the leaders. The leaders' generosity encouraged the people. Whose giving in the past taught and encouraged you in your giving decisions?

3. Whom do you hope to encourage by your giving decisions?

4. What is the connection between surrendered giving and hearts that are loyal to Christ?

Malachi 3:6-12

⁶ "I the LORD do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. ⁷ Ever since the time of your ancestors you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you," says the LORD Almighty.

"But you ask, 'How are we to return?'

8 "Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me.

"But you ask, 'How are we robbing you?'

"In tithes and offerings. ⁹ You are under a curse—your whole nation—because you are robbing me. ¹⁰ Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it. ¹¹ I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe," says the LORD Almighty. ¹² "Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a delightful land," says the LORD Almighty.

5. In the Old Testament, God treated his people like little children, commanding them to tithe or give 10%. In the New Testament, God treats us like adult children, entrusting to us the difficult decision what percentage of our income best glorifies the God who died for us and rose again. Do we give less than the "little children" of the Old Testament or more since God treats us like adults? Discuss this challenge as a group.

6. How do the promises the LORD Almighty gave to the people of Malachi's day encourage you to be a "surrendered giver"?

7. Pray for each other that each might understand what "the whole tithe" is for them as they consider their response to the **Because iT Matters** giving initiative.

MAIN IDEA FOR THOUGHT

Giving brings joy to the giver, joy to the recipient, and joy to our God as he sees his children live and act like him. What gives you joy as you think about your commitment to Because iT Matters and as you pray about your initial gift on the December 3 Celebration Weekend?

1. What has excited you about the Because iT Matters giving initiative? How have you been challenged to think in new and more godly ways about your offerings?

2 Corinthians 9:6-15

⁶ Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. 7 Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. 9 As it is written: "They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever."

¹⁰ Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. 11 You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.

¹² This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. 13 Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, others will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else. 14 And in their prayers for you their hearts will go out to you, because of the surpassing grace God has given you. 15 Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!

- 2. From verses 6 8, pick out at least three lessons to remember as you seek to "excel in the grace of giving."
- 3. "Their righteousness endures forever" (9:9). This quotation from Psalm 112 promises that our righteousness, that is, our generosity to others, endures. How does it increase your joy in giving when you know that our Lord will always remember and appreciate your acts of righteousness?
- 4. Read again verses 12-15. How does it increase your joy in giving as you think about the many who will give thanks because of your generosity.
- 5. Our generous response to **Because iT Matters** will provide many people with reasons to give thanks to God. Look back at pages 8 – 19. Imagine talking to people ten years from now about the results of Because iT Matters. Pick two or three of the following groups of people. What blessing from the Because **IT Matters** effort will lead them to give thanks to God for your generosity?

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the timeline for the Because iT Matters vision?

We will spend the fall of 2023 sharing the vision with God's people to determine the resources God will provide for building expansion.

After our commitments are totaled in December 2023, we will make any changes necessary to our plans based on commitments and our ability to make mortgage payments.

In early 2024, we will develop final plans that will be presented to the congregation for approval. God willing, we will break ground in the fall of 2024 with construction completed late in 2025.

How does this vision impact our entire St. Paul's/The Bridge family?

Our outreach efforts will be enhanced as our quests enter the Gathering Space and experience a comfortable. welcoming atmosphere.

The Gathering Space will also be a welcoming entrance for all our regular worshippers at the Muskego campus, a place where people connect before and after services over snacks and refreshments so that the bonds of Christian fellowship among members are strengthened.

Both worship languages will be blessed by having one staffed nursery and Kids Club in the same building as worship.

The new auditorium will provide a permanent location for The Bridge, relieving the stress of setting up hundreds of thousands of dollars of electronic equipment each week. A very large storage area for tables and chairs at the back of the auditorium will make this space flexible for a variety of uses by the congregation and community throughout the week.

All our youth will be blessed by additional classrooms for the school, by bringing Kids Club and worship into one building, and by providing a multi-use room off the Gathering Space where middle school and high school students can gather for activities outside of Sunday morning.

The Bridge MKE worshippers will benefit as \$200,000 of our mission commitment is designated for remodeling or ministry enhancements at The Bridge MKE campus.

What it is the financial goal of Because iT Matters?

Our current vision for facilities expansion is estimated to cost about \$10 million. The goal of Because it Matters is 1) to generously fund our on-going ministry and mission efforts (\$5 million over two years), and 2) to provide approximately half of the cost of the building expansion (\$5 million over two years). We anticipate that, as Because iT Matters comes to a close in December 2025, we will have another generosity initiative coinciding with dedication of our new facilities to help the congregation pay down the mortgage as quickly as possible.

When do I begin giving to Because iT Matters?

We are inviting you to bring your initial gift to the December 3, 2023, Celebration Weekend worship. It is our prayer that this weekend offering would be the largest single weekend offering St. Paul's/The Bridge has ever experienced.

How do I give to Because iT Matters?

Because this is a "one-commitment" initiative, every gift you give over the next two years will be part of your **Because iT Matters** offering.

You will be able to designate your gifts as you do now for Mission and Ministry, Building Fund, Wisconsin Synod missions, Wisconsin Lutheran High School, or our various other funds.

Currently our Mission and Ministry Fund offerings are used to complete our annual commitment to the synod and high school. Going forward Mission and Ministry Fund offerings beyond what is budgeted for on-campus and off-campus ministry will be placed into the building fund.

How long is my commitment?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment from January 2024 through December 2025. Your initial gift at our December 3, 2023, Celebration Sunday can also be included in that two-year commitment. For tax purposes, you may choose to spread your commitments over four calendar years, from December 2023 – January 2026.

Does my commitment include what I normally give?

Yes. As you consider your commitment, you'll want to factor in what you normally give on a weekly or monthly basis and then add in your expanded giving to the **Because it Matters** generosity initiative.
